

**Dr. Wm. A. Trivette
Claimed By Death**

Death claimed Dr. William A. Trivette, well-known north Iredell surgeon and physician, Tuesday night at the H. F. Long's hospital. Dr. Trivette was 49 years of age and was the founder of the Trivette church conducted by Dr. Trivette's vette Clinic. His death was the result of pneumonia.

Dr. Trivette was born in North Iredell, a son of the late A. W. and Della Crater Trivette. He was a teacher in Wilkes county for few years and later worked his own way through Elon college. In 1912 he entered the Medical College of Virginia from which he graduated in 1916. In 1917 he enlisted in the United States army receiving his commission as first lieutenant in the medical reserve corps.

He returned to his home in 1919 and took up the practice of his profession. In 1932 he opened his hospital known as the Trivette Clinic.

He was married 14 years ago to Miss Gwendolyn Hartley, of Salisbury, who survives; also four brothers and four sisters survive: S. A., of Winston-Salem; Eugene, of North Wilkesboro; D. T., of Greensboro; Dr. L. P., of Mooresville; Mrs. J. N. Binkley, and Mrs. Donald Morefield, of Harmony; Mrs. Emma Sale, of Union Grove; and Mrs. J. F. Johnson, of Hamptonville.

Funeral services were held Thursday morning at 11 o'clock from the Union Grove Baptist church conducted Dr. Trivette's nephew, Rev. O. T. Binkley, D.D. of Wake Forest; Rev. W. H. Lee, of Union Grove, at 10 o'clock; and Rev. Binkley, D.D. of Wake Forest, at 11 o'clock.
